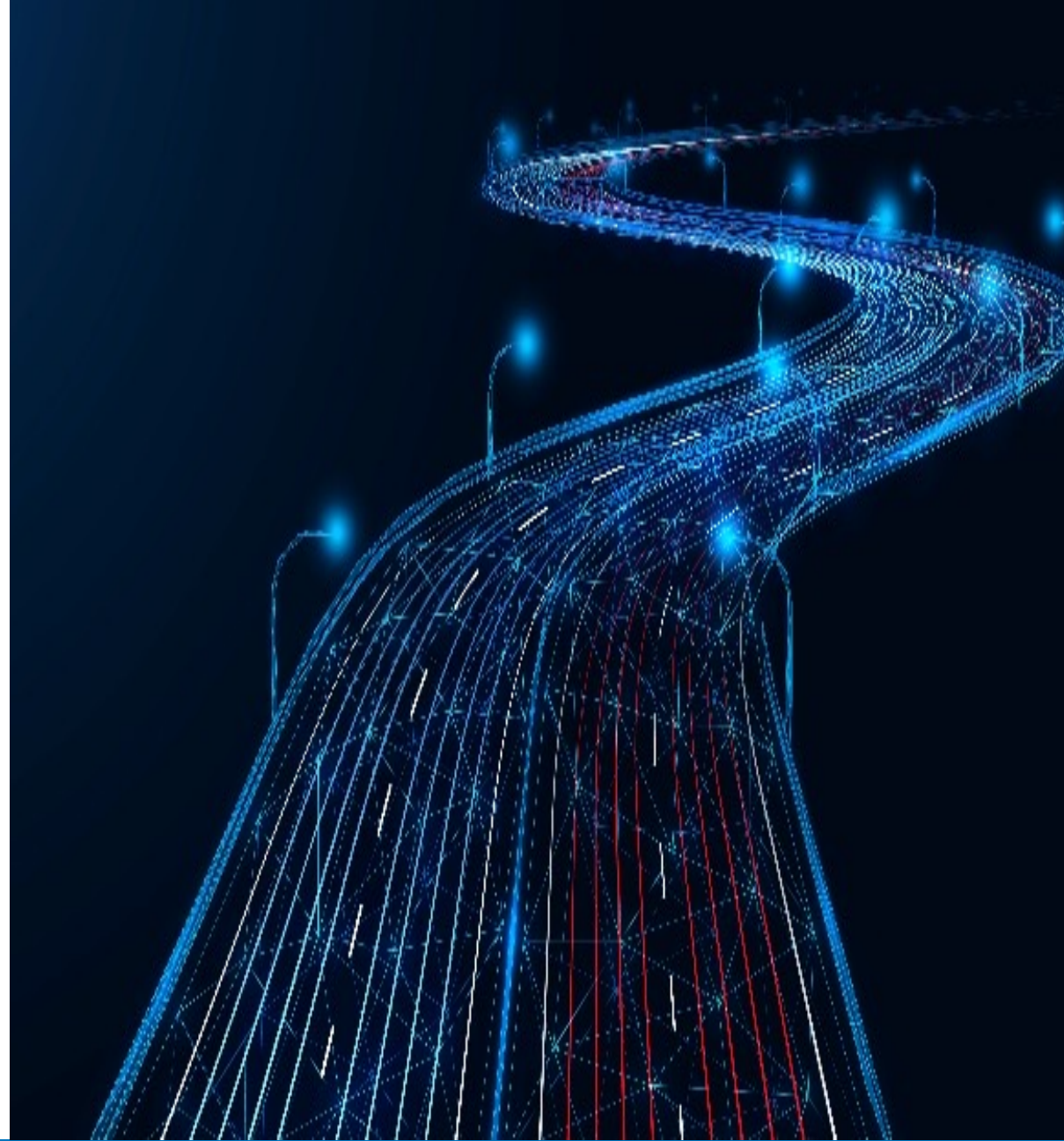

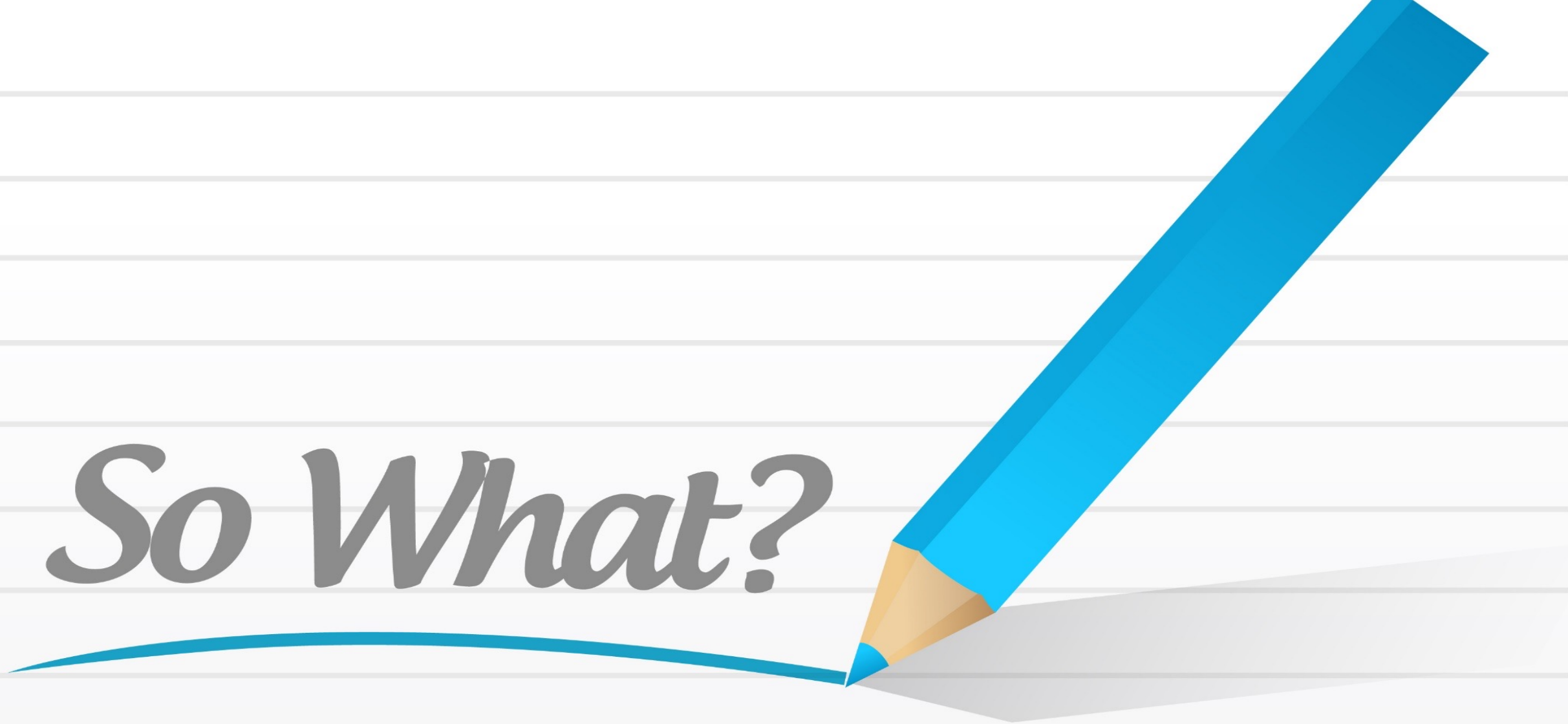

BWC technology has emerged as an integral part of a policing strategy



Why are performance measures important?

- BWCs enable agencies to increase trust and communication with the public

Why are performance measures important?

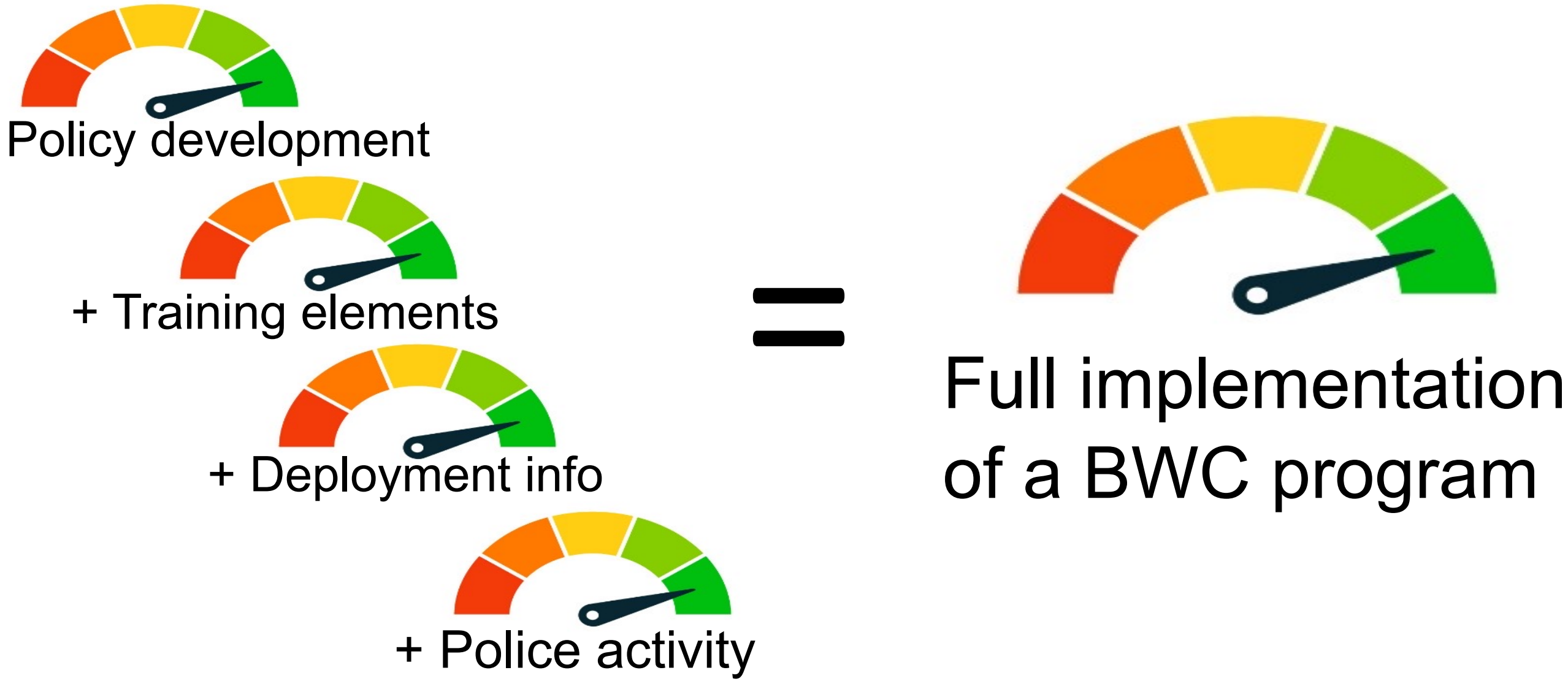
- The SRT BWC program is designed to demonstrate how cameras and footage are used within agencies.



Why are performance measures important?

- Evaluations of BWC programs show that *when properly implemented*:
 - BWCs increase trust
 - BWCs reduce the number of uses of force and the number of complaints
 - Footage is useful in investigations and as evidence in court

SRT Performance = Comprehensive Implementation



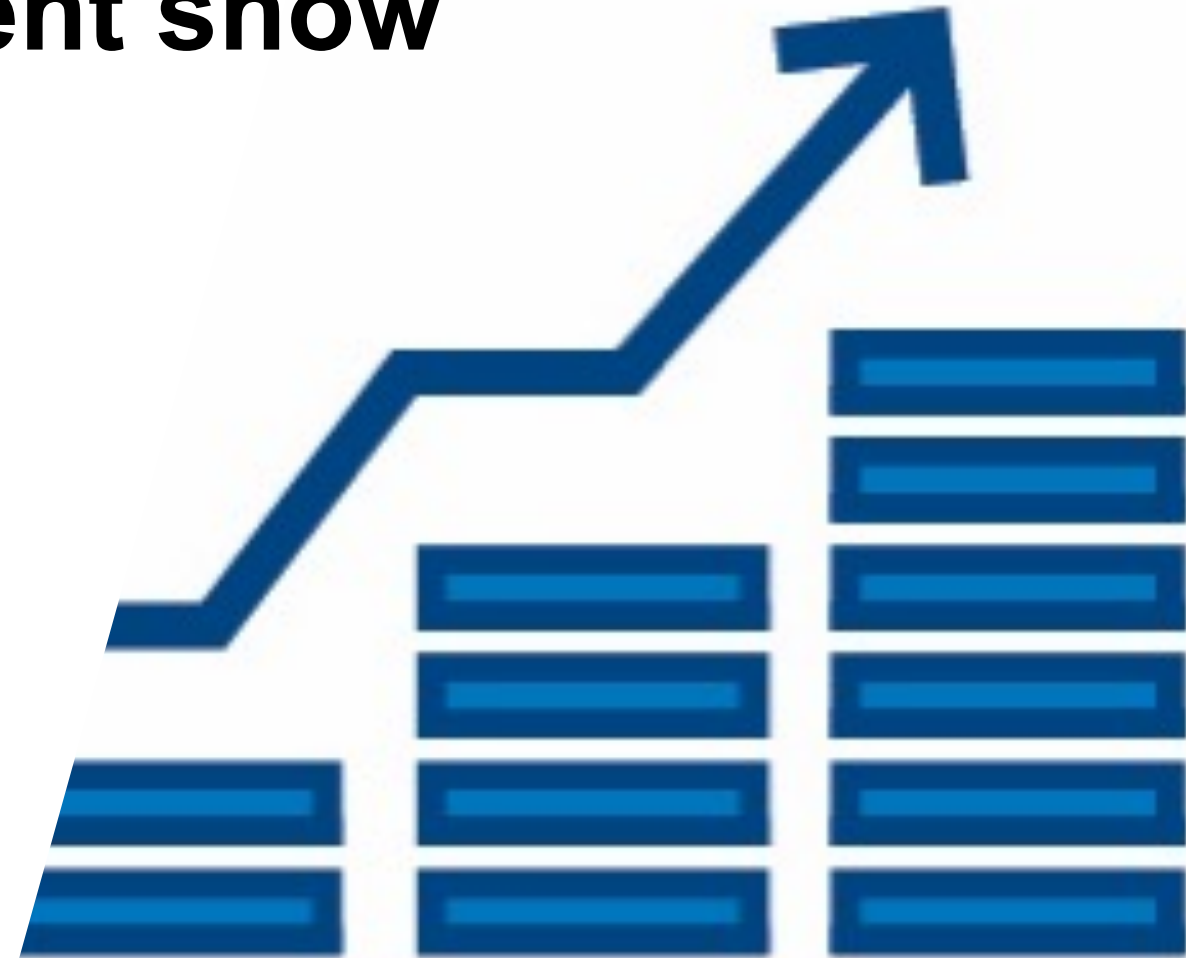

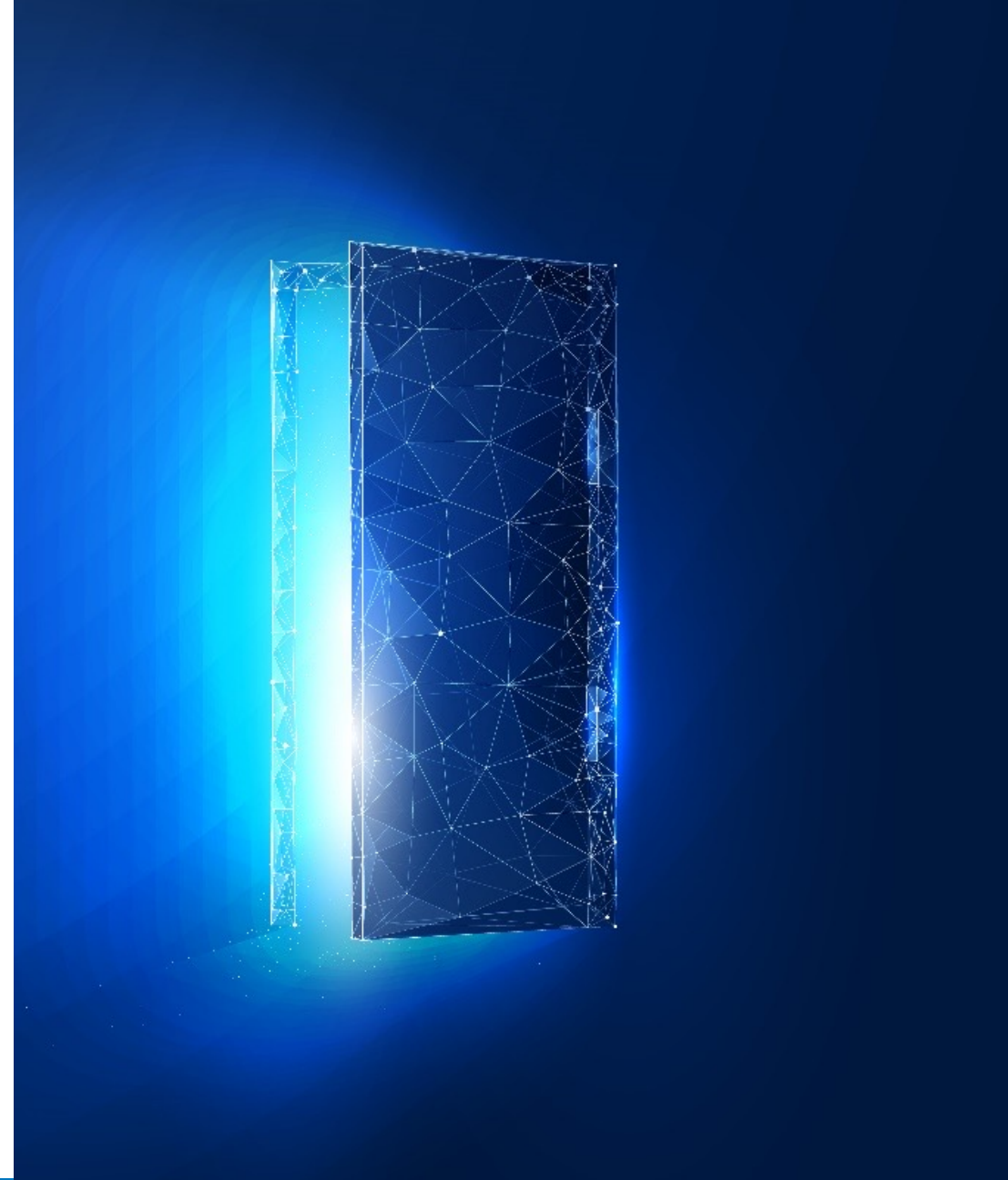


How does my department show performance?
